

IHN Medal

The (Executive) Board of the International Haemovigilance Network (IHN) has created in 2011 a special medal (showing a lion as the symbol for vigilance) to be granted to a person who has extraordinary merits for the society, the International Haemovigilance Network (IHN).

The IHN Medal, consisting of a certificate and a medal can be presented on an annual basis at the International Haemovigilance Seminar (IHS), if appropriate proposals are made.

Nominations for the IHN Medal may be submitted by the Official Contact Person of the IHN members or other IHN participants to the Secretary of the IHN before September 30th of a running year. Nominations should include a letter explaining why it is believed that the candidate has served the International Haemovigilance Network (IHN) as a society in an outstanding way. The deadline for nominations of candidates is September 30 of the year preceding the next IHS where the IHN Medal will be handed out at the closure of the official scientific programme.
